

Introduction | Application Process | PT | OT | Opportunities

Physiotherapy vs. Occupational Therapy

	Physiotherapy	Occupational Therapy
Goal	 Restore movement and mobility Treats the physical source of the injury (tissues/structures) and helps prevent future injuries 	 Restore functional abilities Optimize independence Does not directly treat the injury
Focus	 Assess ability to roll in bed, sit/stand up, maintain balance, walk, etc. 	 Brushing teeth, getting dressed, self-feeding, combing hair, going to the bathroom, etc. Jobs, hobbies, etc.
Tools	• Stretching, exercise, manipulations, electrical stimulation, heat, cold, etc.	• Same, but OTs differ in their approach and overall goal
Setting	Wide range (e.g. Hospita	l, health centres, homes)

Application Process

- Occupational Therapy application process is identical to the application process for Physiotherapy.
- Apply through ORPAS (Ontario Rehabilitation Sciences Programs Application Service)
 - Create an account: http://www.ouac.on.ca/orpas/
 - Non-refundable application fee (\$180)

Application Process

(Important Dates 2015)

- Friday, January 10, 2014
 - Deadline for all application materials
- Friday, January 16, 2014
 - Payment deadline
- Friday January 30, 2014
 - Deadline for receipt of transcripts
- Friday, May 15, 2014
 - Earliest date for offers to admission to PT and OT programs
- Monday, June 30, 2014
 - Deadline for receipt of final transcripts

Fees for applications?

- The ORPAS processing fee: \$190 + an institutional levy of \$90 for each university selection.
- All fees and levies are non-refundable.
- The total fee, including the ORPAS processing fee, is as follows:
 - One university \$280
 - Two universities \$370
 - Three universities \$460
 - Four universities \$550
 - **Five** universities \$640



Extra Documentation

- Some Universities/programs may require you to...
 - Answer additional questions
 - Submit an essay
 - All completed within the ORPAS online application
- References
 - Complete confidential assessment form
 - Submit reference letters
- Transcripts
 - Sent from Registrar's Office to ORPAS
 - \$12 per transcript



GPA Calculation

- Each individual grade is converted to its ORPAS equivalent on a
 4.0 scale
 - 6.0 credit courses have twice the GPA weight of 3.0 credit
- Calculations for sub-GPA will be completed based on reverse chronological order of courses as listed on the submitted official transcript(s).
- Where grades must be extracted from a term to achieve the equivalent of 10 full courses, the average of the term will be used.
- Practicum courses and non-convertible grades (e.g., pass/fail) will not be included in the calculation.

University of Western Ontario

Faculty of Health Sciences

- Two year program, full time only.
- Admission Requirements:
 - 4-year undergraduate degree
 - 6.0 credits:
 - General/Introductory Science
 - SOSC and/or Liberal Arts
 - 3.0 credits:
 - English or Writing Course (essay component-min. 1500 words)
 - Human/Mammalian/Vertebrate Physiology
 - Statistics/Research Methods/Research Design
 - 2 letters of reference (at least 1 academic reference).
 - Online portion: Complete a 500 words explanation of why the applicant has chosen Physical Therapy as a career and why at Western; Describe strengths, experiences, attributes, leadership skills



University of Western Ontario

Faculty of Health Sciences

- GPA calculated using final 60 credits of study
 - Last 10 full courses or 20 half courses
 - Minimum GPA: Not Specified
 GPA Averages

- Recommended: experience working with individuals with physical or cognitive limitations
 - E.g. volunteer/paid work in a hospital
- No Interview

McMaster University

School of Rehabilitation Science

- Two year program (25 months continuous).
- Course Prerequisites for MScPT:
 - A full or half credit in one biological or life science course with a grade of B or higher.
 - A full or half credit in one social science or humanities course with a grade of B or higher.
 - Letter of reference not required
- No Majors are favoured.



McMaster University

School of Rehabilitation Science



Required GPA:

- A minimum average of B or 75% or 3.0/4 from the last 60 units of degree
- All applicants who are interviewed are ranked on:
 - Pre-admission sub-GPA (25% of final ranking)
 - Interview Scores (75% of final ranking) to determine final ranking for offers of admission
- Approximately 300 of the top-ranked applicants to each of the programs are invited for a Multiple Mini Interview
- Cut-off GPA for an interview invitation during the previous cycle:
 3.76/4.0.

Department of Physical Therapy

- Two year program
- Prerequisites:
 - 4-year undergraduate degree
 - 6.0 credits:
 - Human/Vertebrate Physiology
 - Life/Physical Sciences (other than Physiology)
 - SOSC/HUMA/Languages
 - 3.0 credits:
 - Statistics/Research Methods
 - 2 letters of reference: 1 academic and 1 professional
- Changes to 2016 Admission Cycle
 - This will take effect in the 2016 admission cycle (begin mid-October)
 - They will provide information one year in advance to give applicants time to plan accordingly. Changes are related to the prerequisite requirements

- GPA from the 10 most recent completed full courses (or last 20 half courses).
- 2014 Admission GPA Cut-off: 3.76

Computer Administered Profile:

- Only top applicants (ranked by marks) are invited to write the CAP.
- Two-hour evaluation assessing personal/life experiences, knowledge of the profession, critical thinking & problem-solving skills
- Corresponds to 40% of enrolment selection (GPA worth 60%)

School of Rehabilitation Medicine

- Two year program, full time only.
- Prerequisites:
 - 4-year Bachelor's degree
 - 3.0 credits:
 - PSYC 1010
 - Statistics
 - Human Anatomy
 - Human Physiology
 - 2 letters of reference: 1 academic and 1 academic/professional.



Queen's University

School of Rehabilitation Medicine

- Required Undergraduate GPA:
- <u>Sub-GPA</u>: most recently* completed 10 full (or 20 half) courses
 - Cut-off ≥3.55
- <u>Cum-GPA</u>: All years of undergraduate study
- Personal Submission Questions
 - Reasons for choosing PT as career and knowledge of profession
 - Extra-curricular involvement related to PT
 - Other community involvement



University of Ottawa

School of Rehabilitation Sciences

- 2 year program.
- Admission Requirements:
 - Must be fluent in French (written and spoken)
 - 6 credits:
 - Anatomy & Physiology
 - 3 credits:
 - Psychology
 - Statistics
- Required GPA:
 - an average of "B "(70 %) or higher
- Volunteer experience or work in counselling over the last three years would be an asset.



Dep. of Occupational Science and Occupational Therapy

- Admissions are determined through academic and nonacademic achievement (academics are weighted more heavily)
- Two year program, full time only
- Admission Requirements:
 - 4-year undergraduate degree OR 3-year undergraduate degree with an additional 5 full courses
 - Statement of intent and a resume
 - No course prerequisites



Dep. of Occupational Science and Occupational Therapy

- Recommended background knowledge in:
 - human growth & development
 - introductory physiology OR introductory human biology
 - psychology
 - sociology OR anthropology
 - statistics & research design
 - ✓ No interview required
 - ✓2 Letters of reference: 1 academic and 1 personal



Dep. of Occupational Science and Occupational Therapy

- Required GPA:
 - Final Year: Mid-B (competitive: A)
 - Initial Ranking: GPA from the most recently completed
 10 full courses (as of Dec 31st)
 - Students in a 3-year program must complete an additional 5 full university courses at the senior level (third and fourth year)

University of Western Ontario

School of Occupational Therapy

- Two year program, full time only
- Application process:
 - Completed ORPAS application; official transcripts; personal submission section of the online application
 - No interview
- Prerequisites:
 - 4-year Bachelor's degree any major
 - No course prerequisites and No letters of reference



University of Western Ontario

School of Occupational Therapy



Required Undergraduate GPA:

- GPA from the most recently completed 10 full courses OR 20 half courses (as of Dec 31st)
- GPA of: 3.5 3.7 OR better are considered to be competitive
- No reference letters required

Queen's University

Occupational Therapy Program



- Two year program, full time only
- Admission Requirements:
 - 4-year Bachelor's degree or equivalent
 - No course prerequisites
 - No interview
- Supplementary Documents:
 - 2 letters of reference: 1 & 1 academic

Queen's University

Occupational Therapy Program



- Statement of Intent (Personal Submission section of the online application)
- Resume

Required GPA:

- First cut-off: applicant-pool-dependent minimum GPA for all undergraduate years (typically 3.0 or higher)
- Second cut-off: assessment of the candidate's
 Confidential Assessment Forms and Statement of Intent

McMaster University

School of Rehabilitation Sciences



- 4-year baccalaureate degree (120 units/credits) or equivalent
- Academic Requirements:
 - 3.0 GPA (or a "B") calculated over last 60 credits
 - GPA is calculated in the final two years (or in the last 10 full-course equivalents)
 - No prerequisites required
 - The cut-off was 3.48/4.00 in 2012 and 3.60/4.00 in 2013.

McMaster University

School of Rehabilitation Sciences



- Other Requirements:
 - All eligible applicants are ranked solely on the basis of their GPA
 - Requires an interview
 - All applicants who are interviewed are ranked on a combination of:
 - ...pre admission sub-GPA (25% of final ranking)...
 - ...interview scores (75% of final ranking) to determine the final ranking for offers of admission...
