What is Bethune College and why is it important to me?

York is a big university. This means that you have lots of choices for disciplines and programs. Unfortunately, it can also be a little intimidating at first. Colleges exist to help make a big university feel small. They are a place to study, hang out, and participate in a smaller, more intimate setting. They are a place where you can feel at home.

Who is a Bethune student?

Everyone is assigned to a college when they enter York based on either their program of study or the residence that they live in. Bethune College is associated with the Faculty of Science and Engineering. Students in that faculty, those studying Science & Technology Studies in LAPS, and those that are in the Bethune Residence are automatically members of the college.

What does Bethune offer?

- At Your Service: Study Hall, Quiet Study Room, Junior Common Room & JACS Student Lounge, Piano Room, Meeting Rooms.
- Bethune Residence: home to 260 students from across the world.
- Life Sciences Help Centre: peer-tutoring help in the core 1st-year science courses, every afternoon.
- Student Ombuds Service (SOS): a drop-in academic resource centre staffed by knowledgeable upper-year students who can help you with academic issues.
- Bethune Writing Centre: provides one-on-one tutoring to help you polish your writing skills.

- Elective academic (credit) Bethune courses: BC 3000, 3010 and BC 3900 in Peer Leadership, and/BC 3030, an upper-year science writing course to help you improve those lab reports.
- Academic and Career Seminars: speakers, discussion groups and other programs to interest students and faculty.
- Bethune College Council: our student government in charge of social, cultural and sports events both on and off campus, the college newspaper (The Lexicon), social orientation, student lounges. It also oversees the Bethune Athletics Committee, which manages recreational sports activities and intramural sports.

 Student Clubs.
