
Pharmacy College Admission Test (PCAT)

- Held for four testing windows
 - July, September, October/November, and January
 - October 28 November 1, 2013
 - Can still register, but late fees apply (\$49.00)
 - January 7-8 2014
 - Registration open
 - First come, first served basis

PCAT Format

- 6 sections
 - 1. Writing
 - 2. Verbal Ability
 - 3. Biology
 - 4. Chemistry
 - 5. Reading Comprehension
 - 6. Quantitative Ability



 Must achieve certain minimum standards to be considered for admission into University of Toronto

PCAT – Writing

Writing

- 30 minutes to suggest a solution in essay format to a given problem
 - i.e. Discuss a solution to the problem of America's dependence on imported non-renewable fossil fuels such as oil

PCAT – Verbal Ability

- Verbal Ability
 - Analogies
 - Sentence Completion
 - i.e. INEPT : SKILL :: FLIMSY : ("Inept" is to "skill" as "flimsy" is to...)
 - a. Power
 - b. Weight
 - c. Strength
 - d. Thickness

 - Answer 48 multiple choice questions based on the passages:
 - Comprehension
 - Analysis
 - Evaluation

PCAT – Quantitative Ability

- Quantitative Ability
 - Basic Math
 - Algebra
 - Probability & Statistics
 - Precalculus
 - Calculus
- Note: no calculators



Bachelor of Science in Pharmacy (BScPhm)

- First new pharmacy school in Canada in 20 years!
- Admits 120 students each September
- Four year professional program:
 - 7 academic terms
 - 4 co-op work terms

Academic Requirements

- Minimum University Average of 75% (3.3/4.0 or 7/9.0 GPA)
- Full course load (30 credits per year)
- PCAT not required
- Must pass interview

Prerequisite Courses (University of Waterloo)

- Introductory (6 credits):
 - SC/BIOL 1000 and SC/BIOL 1001
- Genetics (3 credits): SC/BIOL 2040
- Microbiology (3 credits): SC/BIOL 3150

Chemistry

- General Chemistry with lab (6 credits):
 - SC/CHEM 1000 and SC/CHEM 1001
- Biochemistry with lab:

 - Essay about you and your involvement in activities
- References
 - Preferably from a pharmacist, or a physician or nurse (no relatives)
- Interview
 - Conducted by faculty members and pharmacists
 - Includes a Reading Comprehension/Writing Test

The Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) Program

- Four-year professional program
- Admits 240 students each September
- Applicants must meet the following requirements:
 - Academic Performance
 - Pharmacy College Admission Test
 - Interviews

Academic Performance (University of Toronto)

- Cumulative average of 70% (B-average) or higher
- Preference given to candidates with full course load
- Completion of all prerequisite courses by the Spring of admission year
 - Requires at least 2 years of university study

- English
 - ENG4U or Grade 12U equivalent
- Physics
 - SPH4U or Grade 12U equivalent
- Introductory Biology
 - SC/BIOL 1000 3.0 and SC/BIOL 1001 3.0
 - (Or formerly SC/BIOL 1010 6.0 OR 1410 6.0)

- Introductory Chemistry
 - SC/CHEM 1000 3.0 and SC/CHEM1001 3.0
- Organic Chemistry
 - SC/CHEM 2020 6.0
 - SC/CHEM 2020 3.0 SC/CHEM2021 3.0
- Physical Chemistry (Thermodynamics/Kinetics)
 - SC/CHEM 2011 3.0

- Biochemistry
 - SC/BIOL/BCHM 2020 4.0 OR 3.0
 - Or SC/CHEM 2050 4.0
- Statistics
 - SC/MATH 1131 3.0 OR 1532 3.0 OR 2560 3.0
 - Non-math department: SC/BIOL 2060 3.0 or PSYC2021 3.0 or HH/KINE 2050 3.0

- Calculus (6 Credits)
 - SC/MATH 1013 3.0 + SC/MATH 1014 3.0
 - OR SC/MATH 1300 3.0 + SC/MATH 1310 3.0
 - OR GL/MATH 1930 3.0 + 1940 3.0
 - Note: SC/MATH1505 is NOT acceptable

- Humanities/Social Science (6 credits)
 - 6.00 credits in Humanities or Social Science
 - Examples:
 - History
 - Religion
 - Philosophy
 - Classics
 - Music

- Languages
- Literature
- Economics
- Sociology
- Political Science

Mandatory Interviews

- Must meet minimum PCAT & academic requirements
- 2014 dates: March 22-23 and May 10
- Multiple mini interview format:
 - 8-10 short interviews
 - 7 minutes each



Interviewers: pharmacists, faculty, students, etc
