General Requirements for becoming a Teacher

- Complete minimum three-year postsecondary degree from an acceptable post-secondary institution
- have successfully completed a four semester teacher education program
- apply to the College for certification after BEd

2 Streams of Bachelor of Education Program

- I) Concurrent (5 or 6 years)
 - Direct Entry from high school/upper year entry
 - Pursue 2 degrees at the same time
- I) Consecutive (3 or 4 years + 2 years)
 - Already completed another degree
 - Apply through <https://www.ouac.on.ca/teas/>. TEAS (Teacher Education Application Service)

Teaching Levels

Graduates of our BEd program can be certified to teach in Ontario in 2 of the following grade levels:

- **Primary** (JK - Grade 3)
- **Junior** (Grade 4 - 6)
- **Intermediate** (Grade 7-10)
- **Senior** (Grade 11-12)

So you would be qualified to teach primary/junior, junior/intermediate, intermediate/senior

Keep in mind each school has different requirements

York University - Consecutive

Typically, 2,400 applicants compete for approximately 300 spaces

York University - Consecutive

Requirement:

Approved undergraduate degree with a minimum overall GPA of B, based on the final two years (60 credits at York or equivalent)

York University - Consecutive

Online Supplementary Application

Experience Summary and Profile

Personal Statement

2 online letters of reference

York University - Consecutive

Selection

Based on GPA, experience, a personal statement, and two online letters of reference.

Each school has its own selection method

York University - Consecutive

Deadline to apply: **December 1st, 2020** (TEAS application)

Deadline to submit online supplementary form: **December 18th, 2020**

- **Primary-Junior (JK - 6)**
 - No subject specialization required
- **Junior-Intermediate (4-10)**
 - Choose to specialize in one Junior-Intermediate teaching subjects
- **Intermediate-Senior (7-12)**
 - Choose to specialize in two Intermediate-Senior teaching subjects

4. CASPER (last day to sign up for a test in 2020-2021 cycle is Sunday, January 17th, 1:00 EST)
5. Submit Transcripts and supporting documents

Sample CASPER Question

Think of a time when you had to make a sacrifice in order to accomplish a goal.

Questions to the Applicant

1. Briefly describe the situation and the sacrifice you made.
2. Do you regret your decision to make the sacrifice? Why or why not?
3. Did you learn anything from this situation that can be applied to your desired career? Explain your response.

Western University

Academic Requirements

- For admission in September 2021, you must be on track to complete your undergraduate degree by Aug. 31, 2021.
- You must have successfully completed the equivalent of 10 full university credits at the time of your application. Preference is given to those who have a four-year degree with the equivalent of 20 full credits.
- You must have a minimum average of 70% in your best 10 full or equivalent undergraduate courses.

Experience working with learners

Proficiency in English

Additional requirements for Junior-Intermediate/Intermediate-Senior

JI - At least 3 full year courses in chosen teachable

IS - At least 6 full year courses in primary teachable, at least 3 full year courses in secondary teachable

Brock University

B10- Primary Junior

- ❑ Do not pick a teachable - variety of subjects you will be teaching
- ❑ Preference is given to applicants with...
 - Child and Youth Studies Major
 - Early Childhood Education majors
 - those who completed university degree-level courses in one or more of the following: Mathematics, Science and/or English

B20- Junior/Intermediate (Pick 1)

Teaching subjects include: Dramatic Arts, English, French, Geography, Health and Physical Education, History, Mathematics, Music (Vocals), Science, Visual Arts

Brock University

B30- Intermediate/Senior (Pick Two)

Teaching Subjects: Dramatic Arts, English, French, Geography, Health and Physical Education, History, Mathematics, Science (Biology, Chemistry, General, Physics), Visual Arts

Brock University

General Requirements

B average (70%) for whichever division you are applying to (50% of your admission)

Experience profile - two significant teaching related experiences totalling 200 hours (remaining 50%)

Proficiency in English

Completion of a recognized and acceptable degree

→ B10

- Encouraged to have an area of concentration related to school curriculum

Brock University

B20

- At least three full undergraduate credits where...
 - One full undergraduate credit must be at the second year level or above
 - $\frac{2}{3}$ of the teaching subject credits must be completed
 - *** teacher subjects credits NOT COMPLETED by the time of application must be marked as “in progress” ***

Brock University

B30

→ First Teachable

- 5 full undergraduate credits
- $\frac{3}{5}$ of the undergraduate credits must be from the 2nd year level and above
- *** teacher subjects credits NOT COMPLETED by the time of application must be marked as “in progress” ***

→ Second Teachable

- 3 full undergraduate credits
- $\frac{1}{3}$ undergraduate credits must be from the 2nd year level and above
- *** teacher subjects credits NOT COMPLETED by the time of application must be marked as “in progress” ***

- ❑ Applications are ***still open until December 1st 2020***
 1. Choose a program division → B10, B20, B30
 2. Submit the TEAS (Teacher Education Application Services) through OUAC
 3. Submit Required Documents → transcripts of all post-secondary institutions you attended
 4. Complete your Experience Profile
